- continuously evaluating Saab's existing intellectual property portfolio in order to identify and pursue business opportunities within alternative fields of use both inside and outside the company group
- managing and enforcing Saab's intellectual property rights in order to control legal risks
- protecting Saab's intellectual property rights against any misrepresentation and not tolerating any infringement or abuse thereof
- always respecting valid intellectual property rights belonging to third parties.
